Products Containing Mercury:

Ni-Cad batteries, thermostats, thermometers, dimmer switches, CFLs and fluorescent tubes are accepted. Mercury bearing thermometers can be exchanged for a non-mercury bearing version.

Acceptable Paint & Paint Products



- Oil paint, stain, varnish, thinner, turpentine, strippers
- Keep in original container, mark content if label is illegible
- Five (5) gallon limit/person
- Creosote, preservatives and bleaches are not accepted.
- No latex paint
- **No Contractors**

Did you know?

Latex paint is not hazardous material & can be disposed of in your regular trash. Remove lid, air dry or add kitty litter or sawdust to speed up drying.

Clothing/Textiles

Clothing & and textiles are reused and are also recycled into carpet padding and other items, so please donate by bringing to the Recycling Center's special collection box for those items.

Household Hazardous Waste

Household hazardous waste collections take place during one day events (spring and fall). Electronics, televisions, computer monitors, tires & batteries are collected as well, for a fee. Events are scheduled for **9/12/2009 AND 5/16/2010**.

Clean Harbors collects hazardous waste Saturday mornings March 7 - November 28, 2009. For information and pricing call 781-380-7110.

Free exchange of mercury thermometers for a non-mercury digital version is available at the Health Department, 90 Pond Street, or the Recycling Center during normal business hours. For safe transport, pack carefully to avoid breakage.

Turn in your old mercury bearing thermostat at the Health Department, 90 Pond Street during normal business hours or on hazardous waste day, and receive a non-mercury version or Dunkin Donut coupons.

Cell Phone Recycling

Donate any brand of cell phone to benefit shelters and law enforcement agencies directly involved in protecting and rebuilding the lives of people dealing with domestic violence. Program sponsored by Verizon and your Recycling Committee.

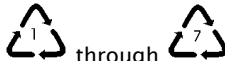


You can reduce trash costs by reducing trash at the curb. Less trash = less cost. It's your hard earned money going to "waste"...Trash has a high price tag. If you recycle all you can, you will reduce your trash to 1 or 2 barrels.

Paper, cardboard, plastic, bottles & cans now all go together, in any order in your recycling bins or barrels. Recycling is collected weekly on trash day.

- ✓ Newspapers, including inserts, paper bags, paperbacks, phone books, magazines, junk mail, brochures, flyers, catalogs
- ✓ Office paper, envelopes, file & hanging folders, faxes, post it notes, phone books
- ✓ Boxes (empty)-cereal boxes, shoe boxes, pasta boxes, cracker boxes, etc. with liners removed
- ✓ Cardboard
- ✓ Milk and juice cartons

- ✓ Colored and construction paper
- ✓ Books with hard covers removed
- ✓ Glass bottles & jars, all colors
- ✓ Aluminum food/beverage containers
- ✓ Tin and steel cans & lids
- ✓ Beverage/ milk/juice/water containers

PLEASE DO NOT INCLUDE ANY TYPE OF PLASTIC BAG WITH YOUR CURBSIDE RECYCLING.

PLASTIC STORE BAGS CAN BE RECYCLED AT ANY MARKET NO MATTER WHERE THEY COME FROM. RECYCLING CONTAINERS ARE INSIDE THE DOOR OF EVERY MARKET.

Non-Recyclable Items: Window glass, glass cookware, ceramics, clay pots, food contaminated boxes such as pizza boxes (clean tops OK), Styrofoam cups & plates and foam packing material. Foam peanuts can be recycled at Mailboxes Etc. locations. Plastic store bags can be recycled at any grocery store no matter which store it came from. Coat hangers can be recycled at dry cleaners.

Curbside Yardwaste (leaves/grass/twigs, only) will be collected curbside Saturdays: Collections begin again: 10/5, 10/19, 11/2, 11/16, 11/30/2009. All yardwaste must be in brown paper leaf bags or a container from which materials may be emptied. All other materials such as branches and brush should be taken to the Plain St. Compost Site.

Christmas Trees collected curbside weeks of Jan. 4th & 11th, 2010. After that, please drop off at Plain St. Compost Site, 7:30AM-3:00PM at schedule listed below.

Compost Site Drop-off: Grass leaves branches, brush, & Christmas trees.

Open: April 1-January 31: **Monday-Saturday, 7:30 AM--3:00PM.**

Open: February & March: **Monday – Friday** from 7:30AM-3:00PM.

Appliances & Large Metal Items are collected 1 week per month. Call Capitol Waste-617-569-1718 to request pickup on your regular trash day during any of the following weeks: Week of 6/8, 7/6, 8/3, 9/14, 10/5, 11/2, 12/7/09 & Week of 1/4, 2/1, 3/1, 4/5, 5/3 & 6/7/2010.

- Residents may use a "SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING" sticker applied to the side of a trash barrel to create a larger "recycling bin". This will enable residents to recycle more from the trash. Stickers are available at: DPW Garage, Council on Aging, Recycling Office @ 90 Pond St., Town Hall or the Recycling Center on Ivory St. To have sticker & info mailed, call **781-794-8060**, and leave name and address.
- **Trash or Recycling Containers with improper materials** or those set out late (must be out by 7AM), will not be collected.
- TV's & Computer Monitors not collected curbside.

- **Bulk Items/1 per week:** Mattress, furniture, carpet & lumber (4' lengths, bundled, limit 3 bundles/week).
- **Compost Bins** available: Saturdays at Recycling Center, 9AM-2PM - \$30
- **Propane Tanks** accepted at SEMASS residential drop-off site/Ivory St. No charge.
- **Holiday Week Schedule:** When a scheduled collection day falls on a holiday, that day's collection & all remaining collection days for that week will be delayed 1 day. Holidays are:

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING is collected on your regular trash day. Place all items into one receptacle, NO SEPARATING. All paper, all colors, (clips and staples OK), Paperboard (cereal boxes, shoe boxes), Newspapers, Magazines, Telephone Books, Soft Cover Books, Junk Mail, Envelopes, Cardboard, Paper Bags, All Plastic Bottles and Containers, Milk & Juice cartons & plastic containers, plus Bleach/Detergent containers, Shampoo Bottles, Clean Food Containers (cottage cheese, margarine, yogurt), Glass Bottles/Jars, all colors, Clean Aluminum (plates/trays/foil), Clean Metal Cans (tin/steel/aluminum), Empty Aerosol Cans (paint/hairspray/cleaners).

NO Paper Towels, Napkins, Toilet Paper, Plastic Bags, Dishes, Ceramics, Pyrex, Fabric, Foam Packaging, Styrofoam, Food or Food Contaminated Items.

APPLIANCES & ELECTRONICS Washers, Dryers, Water Heaters, Stoves, Refrigerators, Air Conditioners, may be placed curbside for pick-up by calling Capitol Waste at 617-569-1718 (If calling after hours, just leave voice mail message.) These items are collected the first full week of the month: 8/3, 9/14, 10/5, 11/2, 12/7/09 & 1/4, 2/1, 3/1, 4/5, 5/3, 6/7/2010. Please call at least 48 hours prior to your regular trash pick-up of that week.

MERCURY containing items: florescent bulbs, Ni-cad & Lithium batteries. Thermostats & thermometers may be brought to the Recycling Center, and exchanged for a digital thermostat or thermometer (one per household).

CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL Tubs, Toilets, Wood, Wallboard, Carpet Linoleum, Tiles, Rubble, Concrete, fencing, stairs, etc. are accepted for a fee of 10 cents per pound, credit card only, at the Braintree Transfer Station, 257 Ivory St., Braintree, 781-843-6209 (Mon-Sat 7AM-3PM). Must have proof of residency.
